Dear Colleagues:

I am pleased to invite you to participate in the 2010 Maternal and Child Health (MCH) Federal/State Partnership annual meeting, Wednesday, October 20, 2010. This year, we will celebrate 75 years of Title V of the Social Security Act. The meeting will be held at the Washington Hilton, 1919 Connecticut Ave., Washington D.C. 20009. We are anticipating that up to 2,000 invited guests and dignitaries will attend. The meeting will have balanced recognition of the Title V programs' numerous past achievements, present challenges and future directions.

I shared at last year's Maternal and Child Health Federal/State Partnership Meeting that the Bureau has been engaged in strategic planning efforts directed at incorporating the life course, health equity and social determinants perspectives in our programs. To this end, the Bureau will also share the first draft of its 2010 – 2015 Strategic Plan to solicit your thoughts and suggestions.

The number of interested attendees for the 2010 Federal/State Partnership Meeting, a 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Commemoration, is expected to exceed the number of available registrations. We will notify you when the registration process opens, and we encourage you to register early to assure that you are able to attend.

While the meeting on October 20 is the flagship event, it will be further enhanced by complementary meetings that are being planned with MCH partners and other programs. Our partners, AMCHP and CityMatCH, will be holding a meeting on Thursday, October 21, titled, "Looking to the Future: What are the Opportunities and Challenges of Health Reform for Improving Maternal and Child Health?" The Division of Services for Children with Special Health Needs (DSCSHN), MCHB, will join with our partners on Thursday in this meeting. In addition, DSCSHN are planning a meeting on Friday, October 22, titled "Strategic Planning for CYSHCN: Envisioning 2020." More information will follow.
